



2019 Canadian Rifle Silhouette Championships

Hosted by the Prince George Rod and Gun Club

***Smallbore (3x40 shots/rifle): June 30, July 1, 2; High Power (3x40 shots/rifle):
July 4, 5, 6, 2019***

The 2019 Canadian Rifle Silhouette Championships will be hosted by the Prince George Rod and Gun Club at two ranges located west of the city of Prince George, B.C. Smallbore (SB) will be shot at our Hartman Range located at 9444 Hartman Road. High Power (HP) will be shot at our Blackwater range located approximately 25 km from the Hartman range (31755 Blackwater Road). Both ranges are accessible from Highway 16. Travel directions are indicated later in this document.

Both smallbore and high power competitions will each consist of three 40-shot matches for each rifle with a total of 120 shots for each aggregate.

Rules-Classification

Current NRA Metallic Silhouette Rifle rules will apply (unless specified otherwise, below). Unclassified competitors will compete in the highest available class. Classification books must be presented when registering at the range.

Competition-Eligibility

Canadian residents must have current SRAC (Silhouette Rifle Association of Canada) membership. Non-residents must be members of their respective national bodies. U.S. residents must have either a SRAC membership or proof of NRA membership. Competitors must present copies of their membership cards prior to the start of the tournament (at the time of picking up their registration package/score cards).

Special Squadding Requests

Requests for special squadding of competitors sharing equipment or coaching will be accommodated where possible on a first come, first served basis provided such requests are made in writing at the time of entry. It will not be possible to consider special squadding requests for late entries.

Certification of Firearms

All rifles must be certified prior to their use in the tournament.

Smallbore rifle certification: June 28/29 (~1 to 7 pm) Hartman Range. **High Power certification:** July 3 (~1 to 7 pm) Blackwater range. Please do not certify High Power rifles before Smallbore matches unless there is no line up. Equipment and apparel may be inspected at random by Match Officials during matches.

Tie Breaking

Following the completion of each days matches, ties will be broken using a single shot knockout format with the exception of National Champion, which will be broken using a five-shot string, fired on Turkeys.

Smallbore Match Schedule (Hartman Range)

Competitors will score for the shooter immediately following them on the firing line. The last relay will score for the first relay. Shoot offs will occur after each match.

June 28 (~12 noon on), June 29	Range open for practice-SMALLBORE ONLY – Competitors are to set their own targets and police the range. Hartman Clubhouse will be open for picking up of registration kits. Watch bulletin boards or posters for official notices.
June 30	8:30 am – Opening ceremonies 9:00 am – One 40 shot Standard Rifle followed by one 40 shot Hunting Rifle
July 1	9:00 am - One 40 shot Standard Rifle followed by one 40 shot Hunting Rifle
July 2	9:00 am - One 40 shot Standard Rifle followed by one 40 shot Hunting Rifle Aggregate shoot-offs following last match.

High Power Match Schedule (Blackwater Range)

July 3	Range open for practice. Competitors are to set their own targets and police the range. Registration packages available for those that did not pick up during SB.
July 4	9:00 am – One 40 shot Standard Rifle followed by one 40 shot Hunting Rifle.
July 5	9:00 am – One 40 shot Standard Rifle followed by one 40 shot Hunting Rifle.
July 6	9:00 am – One 40 shot Standard Rifle followed by one 40 shot Hunting Rifle Aggregate shoot-offs following last match.

Smallbore and High Power Awards Schedule

Presentation of match awards will follow the completion of the daily matches. Aggregate awards will be presented following the presentation of match awards on the final day of each competition. Under three shooters per class, shooters will be moved up to the next higher class, or will compete for Match Winner Award (NRA rule 19.8)

Match Awards and Aggregate Awards

- 1st, 2nd and 3rd placings will be awarded per class in each of the daily matches
- 1st, 2nd and 3rd placings will be awarded per class in the Aggregate standings

Canadian Rifle Silhouette Championship Awards

Pin awards

Smallbore: 10 in a row pins will be awarded to all classes, 5 in a row pins to "AA", "A" and "B" classes
 High Power: 5 and 10 in a row pins will be awarded to all classes.

Safety

All rules for safety will be strictly enforced. Failure to conform will be a basis for disqualification.

1. Rifle actions will be open at all times except on the firing line after the "ready" command is given. At the command "cease fire" all firearm actions will be opened IMMEDIATELY. Open chamber indicators that insert directly into the chamber are mandatory. **2.** "Dry Firing" or aiming firearms behind the firing line is prohibited. Firing line commands must be observed by users of the designated dry firing area. **3.** When not on the firing line firearms will be placed on racks, in cases or other safe places. **4.** A shot fired before the "Ready" command will result in disqualification for the day's match. **5.** The Match Director or Range Officer has the authority to ban any competitor, firearm or ammunition at any time for reasons of safety. **6.** Consumption of any alcoholic beverage, narcotic or controlled substance which can impair the normal mental or physical functions of the body, on the range or in the spectator or public areas immediately adjacent to the range while the range is in use is prohibited. Disorderly conduct or intoxication is not permitted on the range or any contiguous range property. Violators of this regulation will be subject to immediate disqualification from these Championships with no return of entry fees.

SRAC Annual General Meeting

The SRAC AGM will be held the evening of June 30. The meeting time will be posted at the range.

A junior is defined as someone who has not reached their 21st birthday prior to December 31, 2019. A person may compete as a Senior if they are 60 or older before the end of 2019.

There will be one competitor meal ticket included with entry fees. There will only be one meal at the tournament; it will be held on the evening of July 1. Extra meal tokens will be available at \$15 per person.

Advance registration is recommended as tournament entries are limited. Please ensure that you have your classification booklet and classification card from the Silhouette governing body for your country. **SRAC memberships will be available for those that require one.**

***Make cheques payable to: **"Prince George Rod and Gun Club"**, care of Merl Sinoski. If you are unable to attend after registering, please notify the Merl Sinoski (250-640-6744) no later than **June 15**. After that, a \$10 fee will be deducted from your entry refund.

Accommodation

Directions to Prince George Hartman Range (9444 Hartman Road, V2N 6L6) and Blackwater Range (31755 Blackwater Road)

Hartman Range from Intersection of HWY 97 and HWY 16

Drive south 12.5 km on HWY 16 West. You will leave the western city limit of Prince George. Turn right onto Hartman Road; travel 2.2 km north until you see the Hartman Range on the right.

Blackwater Range from Intersection of HWY 97 and HWY 16

Drive south 9.2 km on HWY 16 West. Turn left (east) onto Blackwater Road. Travel 25.1 km down the Blackwater Road. The gate will be on the right (west) side.

Blackwater Range from Hartman Range via Beaverley E Road

Travel 2.2 km south on Hartman Road from the Hartman Range until you get to HWY 16. Cross the highway (you will now be on Beaverley E road). Follow this road for 3.5 km; it will round to the left (west) and intersect with the Blackwater Road. Turn right onto Blackwater Road. Follow the Blackwater Road for 19.5 km. The Blackwater Range will be on the right (west) side.
