

2019 B.C. PROVINCIAL SILHOUETTE RIFLE CHAMPIONSHIPS

Hosted by Mission Rod & Gun Club, 10969 Dewdney Trunk Rd.
Mission, B.C. – March 22-25, 2019

How to find us – From Highway 1, take the Abbotsford exit, (exit 92), to Highway 11, north through Abbotsford. At the 4th set of lights, take right arm of “Y” and follow signs to Mission, approximately 5 to 6 Km.

When on the Mission Bridge, stay in the left lane. You will cross the Lougheed Highway (Route #7) into the Cedar Valley connector, up the hill, that will take you to Cedar Street. Stay on it for aprox. 5 km until Dewdney Trunk Road, where you turn left. After 2km the road turns right (watch for Mission landfill sign), stay on Dewdney Trunk Road 2 or 3 km. The range is on the left (west side of the road) opposite a small lake (pond) at the ram sign.

Competition Eligibility

All competitors must be members of the B. C. Target Sports Association or their equivalent. B.C. Target Sports membership applications will be available at the range.

Course of Fire

Smallbore – 3 x 40 shot matches in each silhouette and hunting rifle.
High Power – 2 x 40 shot matches in each silhouette and hunting rifle

Rules

Current NRA Metallic Silhouette Rifle Rules will apply (unless stated otherwise below). Rule 3.21 empty chamber indicator will be strongly enforced.

Tie Breaking

Ties will be shot off immediately after each match using a single shot knockout format, with exception for the Provincial Championship which will use “best of five” format.

Long runs will be fired at the end of each daily match after the shoot-offs.

Target setters will be provided during the match only.

Small Bore Match Schedule

Friday – March 22

Range is open, only after 12 noon, for sight-in and practice with Smallbore and HP rifles.
Competitors will set their own targets and police the range.
Registration office will be open.
Rifles will be certified.

Saturday – March 23– **9:00 am sight-in and practice until 9:30**

Match 2 – .22 Hunting rifle

High Power Match Schedule

Sunday – March 24

Range will be open for sight-in and practice after the smallbore awards presentation, for approximately 30 minutes. There will be target setters.
Match 1 – HP Silhouette Rifle – **2:00 pm or sooner**
Match 2 – HP Hunting Rifle

Monday – March 25 – **9:00 am sight-in and practice until 9:30**

Match 3 – HP Silhouette rifle
Match 4 – HP Hunting rifle

High Power rifle will be shot at short range on smaller targets as follows:
Chickens – 200 yards. Pigs – 243 yards. Turkeys – 279 yards. Rams – 328 yards

Awards

Provincial and Open, aggregate, match and class awards, will be posted at the range prior to tournament.

Pin Awards

Smallbore – 10 In-a-Row pins will be awarded to all classes. 5 In-a-Row pin to “AA”, “A”, and “B” classes only.

High Power – 5 and 10 In-a-Row pins will be awarded to all classes.

Safety

All rules for safety will be strictly enforced. Failure to conform will be a basis for disqualification.

1. Rifle actions will be open at all times except on the firing line after the “ready” command is given. At the command “cease fire” all firearm actions will be opened IMMEDIATELY. Open chamber indicators that insert directly into the chamber are mandatory.
2. “Dry Firing” or aiming firearms behind the firing line is prohibited. Firing line commands must be observed by users of the designated dry firing area.
3. When not on the firing line, firearms will be placed on racks, in cases or other safe places.
4. A shot fired before the “ready” command could result in disqualification for the day’s match
- 5 The Match Director or Range Officer has the authority to ban any competitor, firearm or ammunition at any time for reasons of safety.
6. Consumption of any alcoholic beverage, narcotic or controlled substance which can impair the normal, mental or physical functions of the body, on the range or in spectator or public areas immediately adjacent to the range, while the range is in use, is prohibited. Disorderly conduct or intoxication is not permitted on the range or any contiguous range property. Violators of this regulation will be subject to immediate disqualification from these championships with no return of entry fees.

Rules – Classification

Current NRA Metallic Silhouette Rifle rules will apply (except for definition of Senior below). Unclassified competitors will compete in the highest available class. Classification books must be presented when registering at the range. A junior is defined as someone who has not reached their 21st birthday prior to December 31, 2019. A person may compete as a Senior if they are 65 years or older.
